# RIBBON PLAY

These super-cute ribbons win the prize for the most functional (yet fun) DIY felt décor around! Just cut out felt strips and circles—and then scallop, notch, stitch and layer them to your heart's content! P.S. They'd be adorable in a classroom too!





**A. TAIL SPIN** Do felt accessories make you bright-eyed and bushy-tailed? DIY a foxy cover for a ready-to-embellish canvas bag (available in Wearables). When you've got it how you like it, slide the bag inside, and make some strategic stitches to secure it.

**B. SIPPING PRETTY** Before you wrap your hands around your mug of joe, how about wrapping that cup in a cute felt cozy? This one has kitschy embroidery detail and a handy button closure. Go to page 7 for the photo-packed step-by-step tutorial.

**C. BOW ME OVER** Something dainty is coming your way—a bare burlap clutch, sweetened up with a handmade felt bow. Try layering colors and patterns for a look like this. And if you want extra style miles, add some decorative stitches with embroidery thread. See page 9 for the how-to.

**D. CUTE TO BOOT** These boots were made for being fabulous, thanks to our rosy embellishment. There's no sewing required for this quick project. Cut felt into strips, and then twist and coil to make the strap and the flower. A little hot glue—and done!

## COMING UP ROSES

We made the chain for this gorgeous any-occasion accessory from beads, charms and bead-capped leaf-shaped pieces of felt. Then we added a trio of felt roses. And guess what? They're just spirals of felt that we coiled into shape.



## UPSCALE FELT

This whisper-light felt beauty is proof that statement necklaces don't have to be big and bold to be fabulous. We made ours from bead-embellished scalloped felt pieces that we glued to a felt base and attached to a dainty chain.



# BE A DEER

What's the best thing about craft felt? It's an easy way to embrace your silly-girl sense of style—and let it run wild and free! Case in point: our flower-decked deer head. If you want to dial down the quirk factor, try the matching garland instead.





## GOOD TO GARLAND

Greenery, be gone! You can DIY this year-round pretty without gathering supplies from the great outdoors. It's made from felt circles, fringed around the edges. You can slide them onto flexible craft wire—it pokes easily through the felt—and voilà!





# SUPPLIES:

- Felt
- Embroidery floss
- Wooden button
- Needles
- Straight pins
- Felt glue
- Water-soluble marker
- Ruler
- Scissors



1

Cut two 11" x 3" rectangles and a 4" x 1/2" strip of gray felt.  
Cut a tea bag label (orange) and a thin strip (white) for the string.

**Note:** Measurements vary for different sized cups.

2

Stitch around label with a running stitch.  
Chain stitch "enjoy" on one felt rectangle.

Use felt glue to adhere label and string to rectangle.



4

Pin embellished rectangle on top of other rectangle, and blanket stitch all the way around.



5

Stitch 4" x 1/2" strip into a loop on the back of one end of felt cozy as shown. Sew button to other end, and place loop over button to hold cozy in place.

# SUPPLIES:

- Burlap clutch
- Felt
- Embroidery floss
- Embroidery needles
- Hot glue gun/glue sticks
- Felt glue
- Water-soluble marker
- Ruler
- Scissors

Cut five strips of felt:

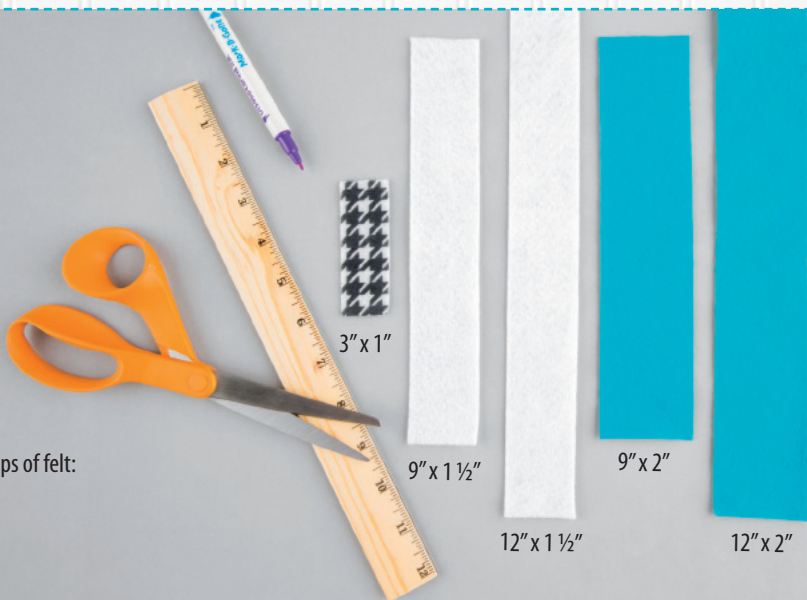
12" x 2"

9" x 2"

12" x 1 1/2"

9" x 1 1/2"

3" x 1"

On the back of the 12" x 1 1/2" and 9" x 1 1/2" strips, draw a light line 1/4" from the top and bottom. Stitch over lines with a running stitch.

Use felt glue to adhere 9" strips together and 12" strips together as shown. Let dry.

Form 12" strip into a circle, and hot glue edges together. Notch ends of 9" strip.

**Note:** Be careful not to cut through the stitching when notching ends.



5

Pinch circle piece in middle to make bow. Wrap floss around middle to secure shape.



6

Place bow on top of notched strip, and wrap floss around middle to secure pieces together.



7

Wrap 3" x 1" strip around middle to cover floss. Hot glue ends together at back. Hot glue bow to clutch.
