



Sew This Bedroom: Roman Shade

SUPPLIES:

- Fabric and lining
- Tassel trim
- Thread
- Tension rods
- Tape measure
- Scissors
- Sewing machine
- Straight pins
- Disappearing ink pen
- Fabric adhesive
- Binder clips
- Seam gauge
- Rotary cutter
- Cutting mat
- Clear grid ruler
- Iron and ironing board



TIPS & TRICKS:

- **Trim Whim:** If you're adding a trim that seems too thick for the sewing machine, you can secure it with fabric glue instead.
- **Give 'Em an Inch:** When making more than one shade for same-sized windows, be sure to write down your measurements the first time around. This will save lots of time on subsequent shades.



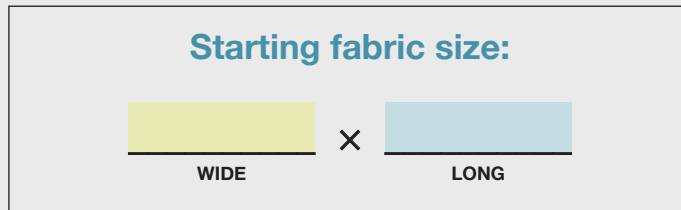
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To get your starting fabric size:

$$\frac{\text{WIDTH OF WINDOW (INSIDE FRAME)}}{\quad} + 1.5" = \frac{\text{FABRIC WIDTH}}{\quad}$$

$$\frac{\text{(A) \# OF DRAPED LAYERS (FOR FINAL SHADE)}}{\quad} \times 6" = \frac{\text{(B)}}{\quad}$$

$$\frac{\text{DESIRED LENGTH OF FINISHED HUNG SHADE}}{\quad} + \frac{\text{(B) (SAME AS ABOVE)}}{\quad} + 3" = \frac{\text{FABRIC LENGTH}}{\quad}$$



To get the size of each section for your draped layers:

$$\frac{\text{TOTAL LENGTH OF SEWN FABRIC AT THIS POINT (TO THE NEAREST INCH)}}{\quad}$$

$$\frac{\text{(A) (SAME AS ABOVE)}}{\quad} + 1 = \frac{\text{\# OF SECTIONS NEEDED}}{\quad}$$
