Generic kitchen towels? Why not make them to order? To get the look: Cut your own oversized monogram from an iron-on transfer sheet, and apply it according to the manufacturer's instructions. Then add smaller ready-to-go letters. Tip: For best results, do not use water or steam while ironing. Let iron-on cool before removing back.

just a shade

A monogram is a lovely way to put a lampshade in a personalized light. But in this case, you can skip the iron. We used double-sided adhesive to adhere the letter and the dots (cut from an iron-on transfer sheet). Tip: Double-sided adhesive makes it easy to change out your design without harming your lampshade.

all in the apron

Every dine-in diva needs a made-to-order apron of her own. To make this one, we sketched letters and a border onto the smooth side of iron-on transfer sheets in two colors. Then we cut out our designs and applied them to an off-the-shelf apron. The finished product? A so-you design that's sweeter than pie.
