**trash bin** Don't sacrifice your style for an off-the-shelf trash bin. Stencil your very own coordinating can. We painted an unfinished wood container and spelled out "trash" in a fun and funky pattern.



**storage boxes** Store your supplies in display-worthy style. Embellish stacks of colorful storage containers with scrapbook paper, and stencil bold labels to identify their contents.



**decorative boxes** Sleek, decorative boxes are a pretty alternative to a boring file cabinet. Stencil coordinating, removable labels to identify the contents of each box, and change out the labels when needed.



**magnets** These letter-perfect alphabet magnets are a terrific way to display "to do" lists, reminders, and favorite photographs. (Learn how to make them on the back panel.)

**filing cabinet** Number desk drawers and filing cubbies so you'll always know where to find the things you need. We distressed these stenciled numbers for a hip, antiqued look.



**memo board** Dress up a plain bulletin board. We stenciled our lettering directly onto the cork for a one-of-a-kind, designer look.



**organize by month** Save the date and save some time. Stencil months of the year onto cheery scrapbook paper, and cut them out for whimsical, easy-to-read lettering.



**Supplies:** Nickel-Size Wooden Disks, Black & Cream Acrylic Paint, Assorted Paint Brushes, Black Stencil Paint Creme, Gold Leafing Pen, Black Permanent Marker, Tacky Craft Glue, Small Craft Magnets.

1. Cover one side of the disk with cream acrylic paint. Allow the paint to dry.



2. When the paint is dry, lay the stencil across the disk and paint over the stencil with black stencil paint creme.



3. Trace a decorative border with the gold leaf pen. Allow the border to dry.



4. Trace carefully around the inside edge of the gold border with the permanent marker for added dimension.



5. Place a dot of craft glue on the back of the disk in the very center. Then place a magnet on top of the glue, and allow it to dry fully before use.

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
