






decorative box

Unfinished Wood Box, Wood Finials, Wood Appliqué, Paint Brush, Acrylic Paint, Scrapbook Paper, Mod Podge, Adhesive, Decorative Embellishments

To create this box, start by painting an unfinished wooden box with acrylic paint. Paint the box legs, top finial, and wooden appliqué to match. Next, cut and adhere scrapbook papers to the top, sides, and inside lid of the box using mod podge. Finally, embellish the box with sequin trim, rhinestones, rub-ons, and your favorite quote.

With danty polka-dots, candy-colored stripes, and delicate blooms, these blissful projects will remind you of laughter, love, and the happy moments of life.



scrapbook

Scrapbook Album, Ribbon, Rhinestones, Sequin Trim, Scrapbook Paper, Rub-Ons, Adhesive

To finish off this blissfull collection we made a cute scrapbook. First, layer two ribbons together and adhere them to the scrapbook album. Next, make a daisy design out of sequin trim and adhere to the scrapbook album as well. For the center of the daisy, cut a circle out of scrapbook paper, embellish it with rhinestones, and put it in the center of the daisy. Finally, we used rub-ons to add a personal touch.







precious tags

Card Stock, Hole Punch, Scrapbook Paper, Rub-Ons, Ribbon, Embellishments

To make a pretty tag, cut a tag shape in the size and shape you prefer from card stock. Use a hole punch to put a hole in the top of the tag. Next, add a message with a rub-on transfer. Then add decoration from shiny rhinestones to versatile sequin trim. For a final flourish, thread a short piece of ribbon through the hole at the top of the tag, and tie it closed.
