It got its game face from bold wood letters. acrylic paint and metallic paint as an outline. We secured plague to stake with a pair of ordinary screws. Easy and fun!

Then, we used screws to secure each plaque to one side of a square-shaped dowel rod, aligning the two plaques perfectly.
