We sweetened up the pot by decorating this sunny topiary with cupcake liners! We alternated between flowers and layers of coordinating liners (see back panel) to give it a fresh-as-a-daisy look.



tabletop topiaries

A daisy-decked topiary is a simple yet stunning addition to a cheery sunroom. This darling piece is perched on a painted dowel rod that's nestled in a floral foam-filled planter. Top it off with river rocks for a distinctly natural quality.



topiaries in triplicate

Trim up your tea table with a trio of topiaries. Start by embellishing moss-covered foam spheres with pretty paper rosettes (Scrapbooking Department). Then display them atop inverted hurricane vases covered in burlap ribbon and trimmed with cotton webbing.

simply succulents

We made this tropical topiary (from the cover) by wrapping sheet moss (secured with floral pins) around a cone-shaped foam base. Then we covered it with a selection of lush succulents and delicate roses.

Tip: Succulents have thick stems, so use a stemming machine to turn them into stable floral picks.



« piece of cake

Layering different sizes of cupcake liners adds depth and interest to this whimsical topiary. Simply stack them, adhere them to the foam sphere with pins and fluff for fullness. Then poke daisies into the sphere until it's completely covered.

on the ball Classic topiary balls make chic centerpieces and eye-popping décor. When you want an elegantly understated look, just secure pieces of moss to a foam sphere with floral pins. Soon you'll be turning out traditional topiaries for every room and occasion!
