You'll serve a hearty welcome home with this treasure-filled recipe box. Just cover a metal lunch pail with camouflage paper. Embellish the rim with ribbon, and tie festive clusters of ribbon and rickrack to the handle. Then, make rugged card dividers by stamping patriotic-themed recipe headers on ink-distressed paper and attaching them to note cards with coordinating brads.

#### rugged ribbon board

This camouflaged ribbon board started as a simple, framed cork board. We dressed it up with scrapbook paper, leather strips, and cute, screw-shaped brads. Now it's ready to display favorite photos and keepsakes in proud, military style.


#### army container

Keep your troops in perfect formation with this handy container. Simply trim a glass jar with ribbon, ball chain, and fun military stickers. Embellish the clear lid with scrapbook paper and alphabet stickers. The finished project is the perfect bunker for small toys, coins and keepsakes.

## courageous clipboard

This cute clipboard is tiny, but triumphant! It's covered with ink-distressed scrapbook paper, and trimmed with coordinating ribbon and rickrack. To complete the look, we stamped a patriotic sentiment on a square of coordinating paper and attached it with a shiny ball chain.


#### framed with honor

Make a trio of frames for a company of heroes. We began with blank paper-maché frames. We covered them with camouflage scrapbook paper, aged them with distressing ink, and embellished them with valiant, military stickers. We completed this keepsake by linking the frames with lengths of coordinating scrapbook ribbon.



#### a hero's welcome

These embellished letters celebrate the bravery of a returning soldier. To create, cover chipboard letters in camouflage scrapbook paper. Then, use distressing ink to add grit and character. Finally, add patriotic detail with coordinating ribbon, military stickers, and a pair of brads that resemble screw heads.





## soldier scrapbook page

Our camouflage paper is the perfect backdrop for a pair of proud photographs. We mounted the pictures on ink-distressed paper, and embellished the page with courageous military stickers, matching ribbon, and shiny brads. We used handy alphabet stickers to finish with a proud declaration.



#### patriotic plate

Make this camouflage plate in no time at all. Start with a clear glass plate, and use decoupage glue to adhere camouflage scrapbook paper to the backside of plate. The finished project is a unique piece that can hold welcome home cookies or why not craft a whole collection of plates to serve guests at a patriotic-themed party.







## **3** letters from home

Keep precious correspondence safe and sound in a rugged, camo-covered album. Just cover a 4" x 5" memory book with camouflage scrapbook paper, add bold alphabet tiles, and finish with fun, coordinating ribbon.

# **4** sentimental bookmark

This spirited bookmark is a sweet reminder of loved ones back home. To make, cut a bookmark shape from our terrific camo paper, layer it with coordinating cardstock, and embellish it with stickers, brads, and a treasured snapshot. Finish with an eyelet and a strip of brown leather for a cute and functional keepsake.

# 5 tagged for triumph

This embellished tag is a special gift for a soldier on the move. Make it in no time from a blank luggage tag. Add scrapbook paper, distressing ink, ribbon, easy alphabet rub-ons, an army-themed sticker, and sparkly red glitter for the heart.

# 6 camo container

To make this adventurous pencil holder, use double-sided adhesive and cool camo scrapbook paper to cover a clear glass tumbler or empty soup can. Then, embellish the container with ribbon and a proud little tag. You can equip your new pencil holder with matching pencils too! Just wrap them with scrapbook paper, and embellish them with our coordinating army stickers.
